

Things for Coaches to consider regarding Umpires

One of the number one complaints at the 2016 PGYBA
AGM was lack of umpiring and quality of umpiring

• We have begun investing in our umpires and we need your support

What has PGYBA done?

- Promoted the program with young up and coming divisions along with kids outside of baseball (ex. hockey refs).
- Increased rates for Peewee and Bantam divisions
- Created a mentorship program for trained adult umpires to umpire alongside first year umpires
- Bought new equipment to provide better comfort and ensure safety as a top priority
- Bought a game scheduling program to reduce conflicts between playing and umpiring younger divisions

Result

- An increase in Umpire Clinic attendance from 12 in 2016 to 46 in 2017
- An increase in total umpires available from 26 in 2016 to <u>55 in 2017</u>.

What we need from our coaches

- Support our young umpires who will inevitably make mistakes
 - Remember its house baseball not the world series
 - Ensure they hold a plate meeting, introduce yourself, try to make them comfortable.
 - They're kids and they can be intimidated, don't take advantage of that (calling balls and strikes from the dugout, kicking dirt etc.)
- Discretionary Calls are not debateable (ex. balls, strikes, outs, safe, catch no catch, foul or fair)
 - Rules can be clarified but the umpires interpretation stands, even if you're sure they are wrong
